

MINUTES OF MEETING HELD

Pursuant to the call of Chairman Maroney, the Senate Committee on Health and Human Resources met on February 7, 2019 at 1:00 PM in the Senate Finance Room, 451-M.

Silent roll call was taken. There being twelve (12) members present, a quorum was established. Chairman Maroney recognized Vice-Chairman Tarr who introduced a motion to approve the minutes held February 5, 2019. The minutes were approved.

Chairman Maroney recognized Cindy Dellinger, Counsel, Senate Committee on Health and Human Resources, who presented Senate Bill 518 restricting sale and trade of dextromethorphan.

Chairman Maroney recognized Vice-Chairman Tarr who moved that Senate Bill 518 be reported with recommendation to pass, but under the original double reference, first to be referred to the Committee on the Judiciary. The Chairman put the question on the motion. The motion was passed.

Chairman Maroney recognized Cindy Dellinger, Counsel, Senate Committee on Health and Human Resources, who presented Senate Bill 519 requiring county emergency dispatchers complete course for telephonic cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Counsel Dellinger responded to questions from the Committee.

Chairman Maroney recognized Vice-Chairman Tarr who moved that Senate Bill 519 be reported with recommendation to pass, but under the original double committee referenced, first to be referred to the Committee on Finance. The Chairman put the question on the motion. The motion was passed.

Chairman Maroney recognized Cindy Dellinger, Counsel, Senate Committee on Health and Human Resources, who presented Senate Bill 60 licensing practice of athletic training. Counsel then presented a Committee Substitute for Senate Bill 60.

Counsel Dellinger responded to questions from the committee.

With leave of the committee, Jenni Johnson, WV Athletic Trainers Association, was administered the oath prescribed by Senate Rule 28a by Chairman Maroney and addressed the committee and responded to questions regarding SB60.

The Chairman put the question on the motion. The motion was passed.
